What We Do For One Another

- We are commanded and exhorted to do all the following for one another:
 - Love John 13:34-35, 15:12
 - Admonish Romans 15:14, Col 3:16
 - Consider, Greet w/ Holy Kiss, Have Compassion, Affection, Pray, Confess to, Bearing w/, Serve, Comfort, Wash Feet, Exhort, Submit, Receive, Have Peace, and Sing.

We Must Consider Others

- Hebrews 10:24-25 *"And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching."*
- Titus 3:14 *"And let our people also learn to maintain good works, to meet urgent needs, that they may not be unfruitful."*

Washing One Another's Feet

- **John 13:1-15**
- **One who is Clean only needs their feet to be washed.**
- **If the Master could do the smallest of tasks in caring for the disciples when He was also giving the greatest of gifts, then we must do so as well.**

The Little Things That Make All The Difference

- **Matthew 25:34-36** *"Then the King will say to those on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me.'" "*
- **When did they do this?**
- **Matthew 25:40** *"And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.'" "*

Using Our Gifts For All

- 1 Corinthians 12:7 *"But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all:"*
- Romans 12:6-15 *"Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them:...; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. ... Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep."*
